Introduction

The NHM envisages achievement of universal access to equitable, affordable & quality health care services both in rural and urban areas. To achieve this, number of strategies has been framed. One among them is to 'Create a District Level Knowledge Centre within each District Hospital to serve as the hub for a range of tasks including, provision of secondary care and selected elements of tertiary care, and the site for skill based training for all cadres of health workers, collating and analyzing data and coordinating district planning. To achieve the same, over the years, there has been an expansion of number of health care services. This has made obligatory for the Chief Medical Officers at district level along with the Deputy CMOs and Officers of various health programs to attend to a comprehensive job responsibilities. Depending on the type and size of the healthcare system, the healthcare administration requires a number of teams working in unison to manage the same at every level. It is felt that due to lack of considerable exposure to various approaches of health care administration and management, it poses difficulty for the district level officers to discharge job responsibilities smoothly. Keeping this in view, a training course on "Health System Management for Strengthening District Health Care Delivery Services" has been scheduled to be held at NIHFV from February 08 - 10, 2020.

The five days training course will enhance the administrative acumen of the participants by making them acquainted with various management aspects of health care services like General Procedures and Guidelines, Human Resource Management, Financial Management, Materials Management, Disciplinary/Vigilance matters and more importantly the management of ongoing programs and projects related to health which are not covered during regular medical education program.

Specific Objectives

This course aims to enhance the competency of the participants and familiarize them with the concepts and practical skills relating to efficiently execute effective and quality district health care services in the country.

Specific Objectives

On completion of the training program the participants will be able to:

- 1) Describe and deliberate the standard procedures and guidelines laid down under different health programs and projects for efficient management of effective and quality district health care delivery services.
- 2) Discuss and delineate the processes of implementation strategies, inputs and outputs of the health care services.
- 3) Explain the possible results/outcomes/health gains and impact of health action, undertaken during the implementation of different health programs and projects.

Course Contents

The course intends to cover topics such as:-

- Implementation Guidelines/ standards
- Team approach Guidelines/standards
- Capacity Building
- Supervision- Type of Supervision

- Monitoring and steps of monitoring

- Management Information System: Introduction and its Uses; Regulatory mechanism
- Financing and Budgeting
